

Primary PE Sports Premium Funding Report 2016-2017

The government has provided additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport.

Eligible schools

Funding for schools is based on the number of primary-aged pupils in years 1 to 6, as recorded in the annual schools census in January. Purpose of funding Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Robert Shaw Primary and Nursery School had a total of 341 students on roll at the consensus so is eligible to receive £9705 in Sports Premium funding for the academic year 2016 to 2017. £2,848 was transferred over from last years funding so the total is £11,958

Accountability

All schools are held to account over how they spend their additional, funding. Ofsted have strengthened the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors' handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE is assessed as part of the school's overall provision.

Physical Education - Aims and Objectives.

At Robert Shaw Primary and Nursery School we feel that Physical education is highly important for the overall development and achievement of every child. PE improves the children's knowledge, skills and understanding, so that they can perform with increasing competence and confidence in a range of physical activities. These include dance, games, gymnastics, swimming and water safety, athletics and outdoor and adventurous activities. Physical education encourages an understanding in children of their bodies in action. It involves promoting positive attitudes towards a healthy lifestyle. Therefore PE will enable them to make informed choices about physical activity throughout their lives.

- Our aims for PE are:
 - To increase children's ability to use what they have learnt to improve the quality and control of their performance.
 - To increase in participation rates in such activities as games, dance, gymnastics, swimming and athletics in and out of school.
 - To increase and success in competitive school sports.
 - To make the PE curriculum much more inclusive.
 - To widen the range of provisional and alternative sporting activities available.
 - To improve work on physical education with other schools and other local partners.
 - To improve links with other subjects that contributes to pupils' overall achievement and their greater social, spiritual, moral and cultural skills.
 - To make children aware of the dangers of obesity, smoking and other such activities that undermines pupils' health.
 - To make children aware of the positive benefits of PE for their overall health.
