In 2017/2018, there were 76 recorded incidents at lunchtime, compared to 29 in 2018/2019 (62% reduction!). Similarly, there has been a 32% reduction in the number of recorded incidents on the playground at any time when compared to 2017/2018. Furthermore, at any one time during the lunch break, there are at least 3 physical activities available including hockey, badminton, football and basketball.
