



## Robert Shaw Sports premium strategy

This statement outlines the planned spending of Sports Premium grant funding for the academic year 2023/24 against the five key indicators which are part of the conditions of the funding.

### Overview

PE and Sport – Planned expenditure for 2023/24	<i>Update against the five indicators</i>
Key indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officers guidelines recommend that primary school pupils undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school	<p>£17,717.50 spent on PE apprentice (£4592.50 – apprentice cost during Autumn term, £13, 125 for Spring and Summer term to have our coach three days a week) – she supports before school, break times and lunch time provision. She helps set up equipment and leads activities. This is on top of the children’s curriculum lessons she supports.</p> <p>£485.90 on PE equipment to support the teaching of PE and break and lunch time provision.</p>
Key indicator 2: The profile of PESSPA being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement	<p>£1,148.60 is the maximum in the budget for playground markings. This will raise the profile of PE and School Sports and will enhance break and lunchtime provision and curriculum lessons.</p> <p>£17,717.50 spent on PE apprentice (£4592.50 – apprentice cost during Autumn term, £13, 125 for Spring and Summer term to have our coach three days a week) – she will lead the Sports Leaders update the PE notice board.</p>
Key indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport	<p>£17,717.50 spent of PE apprentice (£4592.50 – apprentice cost during Autumn term, £13, 125 for Spring and Summer term to have our coach three days a week) – she supports PE lessons and models good practise to class teachers. She also sets up equipment for lessons (following the Complete PE scheme).</p> <p>£485.90 on PE equipment to aid the teaching of PE.</p>
Key indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils	<p>£17,717.50 spent of PE apprentice (£4592.50 – apprentice cost during Autumn term, £13, 125 for Spring and Summer term to have our coach three days a week) - in the Spring/Summer she will run an intra-school Danish Longball league (new to the school). New activities for Sports Days will also be introduced through initiatives from our PE apprentice.</p>
Key indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport	<p>£250 spent on entering School Sport Nottingham’s competition (£25 competition entry with a plan to enter 10 competitions across the year)</p>
