Begin to make sense of their own life-story and family's history.  Continue developing positive attitudes about the differences between people. Pupils retell stories of key leaders from Christianity and Judaism  Pupils ask and find out how to answer a range of 'how' and 'why' questions about how people practise their religion,  Pupils discuss stories of co- operation from Judaism, Christianity  Pupils retell some religious stories with key characters and suggest reasons why they are important to Jewish people and Christians.  Pupils consider what is special about the Torah and respond sensitively, relating to their special things.
